News From Presbytery

1. Elder Kathleen Knott was approved as Presbytery-trained to serve Holy Communion and performed Baptisms *in a pastoral capacity*, under the supervision of Rev. Tim Reddish.
 2. The Report from the Visitation Team to Paulin Memorial was discussed, along with feedback from some of Paulin's members and minister, Rev. Lisa Aide. The Team did extensive listening over several months to various groups, independently: Session, Board, Congregation, Secretary, and Rev. Lisa. After some discussion, Presbytery approved the Team's two recommendations: (a) To hire a professional mediator to help the various parties' function better and communicate together, and (b) To provide a professional mentor for Rev. Lisa to enhance her skill set. Presbytery, Paulin and Rev. Lisa all want to make a success of her ministry.
 3. It was reported that good progress continues to be made at Lakeshore St. Andrews (LSA). In the very near future it is anticipated that a team new elders will be elected. The present average Sunday attendance is 400, down from 660, and new people have come as well as others leave. There has been some restructuring of its staff in light of a reduced budget. Many people from the congregation have stepped-up to help and have volunteered their skills in various capacities, including interim leadership and committees.
